

CELEBRATING OUR 40th Annual On Property Sale

We have had another exciting and very busy year on the farm and hope our 2024 newsletter finds you and your family well. Our sheep continue to evolve as we chase our stud breeding objectives and are looking forward to showing off the latest in our genetics this year.

The focus of our Poll Merino breeding objectives towards a balanced animal with increased genetic fat and muscle has really expressed itself with one of the toughest feed years locally in living memory. A perfect example is this years ewe weaners that were able to capitalise on the amazing summer feed we had with 300 mm of rain falling from November to January and then holding condition through a very tough Autumn and start to winter. The ewe lamb joining in March on the back of the summer flush was also a highlight with the ewes now classed into the stud scanning at 75% conception and 101% embryos. The combination of these top young genetics over our best sires is really speeding up our genetic gain and giving us and our clients access to their progeny 12 months earlier.

Our white Suffolk stud is also showing great genetic gain on the back of significant investment in top sires and making the move to complete Genomics DNA testing. The move to DNA testing the flock has given us 100% accurate parentage as well as increased our data accuracy on a range of ASBV traits.

All rams continue to be fully paddock run with no feet trimming. Our focus is breeding the best performing commercial genetics with the data to back it all up. Managing all our animals under commercial conditions means we are recording true paddock performance to improve our clients bottom line. Genetics is our passion and we look forward to catching up with you this year to discuss what Hannaton genetics can do for you.

One of the most consistent lineup of rams we have offered and this was reflected in the bidding from start to finish in the sale.

On the day 82 rams sold at auction with an average of \$2,277. Top price was a 200155 son in lot 39 selling for \$7,000 and going to return buyers Warooka Pastoral who took home 10 rams on the day. Hannaton 200155 sons dominated the sale with 27 sons selling to an average of \$3,324. Many repeat buyers saw rams sell to SA, Vic and NSW on the day. While competition was strong for the top end of the sale there was also great value for commercial buyers with 46 rams selling for less than \$2,000 on sale day. We would like to thank our loyal client base for their ongoing support and welcome all past clients back to help celebrate our 40th annual on property sale this year.


